How to have the most competitive application ranked in order:

- 1) Have the most total completed courses from all 3 categories above (required to be admitted, required for associate degree graduation, general education courses). Add three CATEGORIES together to get this total.
- 2) Have the most total in-progress courses (during semester before starting your nursing program with the technical college). Add three CATEGORIES together to get this total.
- 3) Have the most credits completed with **UW-Stevens Point**, which can include courses not on this list, such as nursing electives (i.e. priority given to students who completed classes with UWSP versus transferring in).
- 4) Have the highest **UW-Stevens Point Cumulative GPA** (2.5 GPA Required). (non-UWSP/transfer courses are NOT calculated into this equation, including General and Advanced Anatomy and Phys from the tech).

When do I apply to the Nursing Program?

There is not a set requirement on when you must apply, but if you want to follow our sample graduation plan as an incoming freshman starting in the fall, and want to graduate with both your Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) and your Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) within the 4-year time-frame, it is recommended to apply at the end of your second semester of freshman year, while enrolled in General Anatomy and Physiology with the technical college. Transfer students or students bringing in a lot of dual enrollment credits from high school may want to develop a customized grad plan with the UWSP Nursing Advisor to determine application timeline. Students who were required to take MATH 90 based on the math placement test will likely apply during their 4th semester and graduate with the BSN in 4.5 years total.
