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7510.01 - BOSTON SCHOOL FOREST AND COUNCIL

The Boston School Forest and Council was adopted in 2009 and last revised in 2022.

Council Organization

A. Membership on the BSFC will include the following permanent positions:

- 1. The BSF Program Leader
- 2. The BSF supervising administrator
- 3. One (1) teacher from each of the following: early childhood, 1st-3rd grade, 4th-6th grade, Ben Franklin and PJ Jacobs junior high schools; SPASH; and special education
- 4. One (1) principal from each of the following: elementary; secondary school
- 5. One (1) of the directors of elementary or secondary education
- 6. One (1) student from each of the following: Ben Franklin and PJ Jacobs junior high schools; and, SPASH
- 7. One (1) representative from UWSP College of Natural Resources
- 8. One (1) School Board Member; two (2) community members
- 9. One (1) historian
- 10. One (1) representative from Business Department and one representative from Buildings & Grounds
- B. Members may be added to the BSFC at any time as long as the membership does not exceed twenty-two (22) members.
- C. There shall be no limit to the number of years council members may serve. However, appointments are made annually in September. Members may leave the BSFC at any time by notifying the Program Leader or Director of Curriculum in writing. The Program Leader or Director of Curriculum, in turn, will notify the council of a vacancy.
- D. A quorum shall consist of at least one (1) more than half (1/2) of the members.
- E. Only member of the BSFC have voting privileges on all matters to come before the BSFC.
- F. In the event a quorum does not exist, voting can proceed electronically. Actions will be confirmed at the following meeting.
