She had the wisdom- or perhaps she was just tired of me complaining about my sore feet- to take me to the long-running production of Agatha Christie's *The Mousetrap*. I would be lying if I said I had specific memories of the production now (it was some time ago, I sadly must admit) other than remembering I was completely engrossed in the magic that was this murder mystery.

The Mousetrap is the longest-running play of all time. This year marks its 72nd year running in London. Unfortunately, I am not collecting royalties on the original West End production, but I am happy to help bring this production to our UWSP and Stevens Point communities. The Mousetrap holds a unique place in our theatrical canon and its author a very unique place in our world. This is evidenced by one of the unexpected and fascinating facts I came across while researching the play for production. Agatha Christie is the 3rd highest selling author of all-time, behind only the Bible, and Shakespeare. Not bad company to keep, eh?

I hope our production allows you to sink into 1950's Britain, and of course the devilish delicious world of Agatha Christie. Watch your backs! There's a murderer about!!

A Note from the Dramaturg (SPOLIER-FREE EDITION)

Can you keep a secret? Can you keep it for 72 years, like audiences in London's West End have? Like audiences in high school and community theatre auditoriums across North America and in countless other performance spaces around the world have? Whodunit, you ask? Rest assured, you have entered a spoiler-free zone. This lowly dramaturg is not risking the wrath of the theatre gods by spilling the beans now.

And if I did, you certainly wouldn't thank me for it! For legions of mystery fans, the pleasure of reading a well-plotted mystery or watching one unfold on stage or screen lies in the puzzle itself. It's not only about the revelation of the guilty party in the final chapter or last scene. You can fast forward or turn to the back of the book for that. The fun is not in the solution, but in the solving.

Agatha Christie, the best-selling and most prolific of mystery writers in the English language, understood what her audiences wanted, and in 66 detective novels, 19 plays, and multiple volumes of short stories, she endeavored to give it to them in the form of "fair play mysteries." Christie believed that her readers and audiences should have a fair chance of solving the mystery along with the central investigator.

Which brings us to the hard part of my promise to keep this note spoiler-free, because if I lay out for you the conventions and characteristic traits of Christie's writing, I just might spoil the fun for you.

A Note from the Dramaturg Continued...

Instead, I'll wind this up with two contextualizing points:

In 1930, a group of prominent British mystery writers — including Christie, Dorothy L. Sayers, and G.K. Chesterton — founded the Detection Club. Upon entry into the Club, members were required to take an oath, penned originally by Sayers. On threat of expulsion, the writers pledged that their "detectives shall well and truly detect the crimes presented to them using those wits which it may please you to bestow upon them and not placing reliance on nor making use of Divine Revelation, Feminine Intuition, Mumbo Jumbo, Jiggery-Pokery, Coincidence, or Act of God." Of course, had these writers taken their oaths seriously, the Club would have ceased to exist almost immediately. Even more than creating rules, writers love to break them — Christie included.

In 2024, some of the social and cultural attitudes expressed in Christie's work are not ours, but there is still immense pleasure to be found in playing armchair detective and solving the puzzle alongside Christie's investigators, professional or amateur.

About the Playwright

Renowned English novelist and playwright Agatha Christie (b.1890–d.1976) wrote her first detective novel during the first World War. Christie's incisive brilliance was continuously on display in her intricate mysteries, earning her titles such as "Queen of Crime" and "Queen of Mystery." With its focus on psychological analysis and acute observation in crime-solving, her work helped to establish high specificity in the emerging mystery genre and became a cultural phenomenon. Her other significant works include *And Then There Were None, Witness for the Prosccution*, and *The Mousetrap*, the longest-running production in the history of London's West End. The prolific Christie remains the best-selling and most-translated novelist in history.
