Welcome to *Afterimages 2024*! We're so excited for you to join us for an evening of dance!

The Fall Dance Directing Team is thrilled to present nine new dance pieces created by emerging student choreographers. Our program today will introduce you to each of their individual styles, choreographic voices, and artistic approaches.

Afterimages is always an exciting and unique experience in the Department of Theatre & Dance. It allows students to experiment with their artistry in a collaborative space. First-year, sophomore, junior, and senior dance program students and non-dance program students are all a part of this process whether they are dancers, choreographers, designers, or directors. Starting in the summer, 20 student choreographers imagined 21 unique works. At the start of the semester, auditions were held, and each choreographer got to cast their own piece. The dances created were inspired by the life experiences, philosophies, and artistic ideals of each choreographer.

These works were presented in October to an adjudication panel comprised of the dance faculty and a guest adjudicator. The panel shared comments, questions, and critiques with the choreographers in our FeedForward session to help the choreographers clarify their artistic intentions and consider new possibilities. The adjudicators placed the dances into two different concerts: *Forthcoming*, presented at the beginning of November, and *Afterimages*, presented to you today. Throughout the process, all of the choreographers were paired with a faculty mentor, who offered continued feedback and advice.

Afterimages focuses on student involvement—the directing team, stage management, choreographers, cast, designers, and crew are comprised entirely of UWSP students. This show is a special opportunity, not only for dancers and choreographers to explore their artistry, but also for our design students to contribute their growing knowledge in costuming, lighting, sound, and scenic design. This is a shared artistic endeavor that allows for collaboration and contribution from all aspects of our department. We cannot thank the designers enough for their irreplaceable contributions and unique flair.

Furthermore, we thank Stage Manager Bastien Howard and Assistant Stage Managers Paul Been and Maikla Wilson for their assistance.
