The program does not provide transportation to and from Stevens Point. Participants need to bring their own spending money for personal items.

ELIGIBILITY



You are eligible to apply for admission to the ENGLISH FOR COLLEGE program if:

- You are an English language learner
- You will be entering the 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade in the fall of 2025.
- You attended a Wisconsin school during the 2024-2025 school year.
- You have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0.
- Your teacher, counselor, principal, or a WEOP staff member recommends you.
- You know enough academic English to understand your teachers in a classroom setting.
- Your family is eligible for free/reduced school meals.

Please note: UWSP credits are not earned in EFC.

APPLICATION INFORMATION

To apply for English for College (EFC) 2025, follow the checklist below:

1. A letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, principal, or WEOP staff member.
 2. UWSP English for College Application
 3. Official grade report/transcript with your cumulative GPA from your high school. *(Submitted with application)*
 4. Essay telling us why you would be an excellent member of our EFC learning community, 1-2 pages maximum *(Submitted with application)*
 5. Wisconsin DPI Precollege Scholarship Application Form
 6. Signed EFC Rules form
