A Note from the Director

This play is an unknown gem. A Cry of Players, comes from Hamlet, speaking "Would not this ...get me a fellowship in a cry of players, sir?" in Act 3, Scene 2. Both Hamlet and Shakespeare believing in plays and the players who perform them. The original Broadway production in 1968, was led by the famous players, Frank Langella as Will and Anne Bancroft as Anne, who was in Gibson's original Broadway productions of Two for the Seesaw and The Miracle Worker.

The story is a dramatization of the early youthful life and loves of William Shakespeare. However, Gibson only calls Shakespeare WILL in the play, and Anne Hathaway (Shakespeare's wife, and mother to their three children) as ANNE. Since very little is known about WILL and ANNE's early life together their relationship has been the subject of much discussion and speculation by many historians and writers through the years. Also, naming these characters only WILL and ANNE gives the sense and freedom that WILL can be any poet, at any time. Any actor, artist, musician, or passionately driven person who's longing and yearning for more. To take a bite out of life, and receive the answer to "what are we for?" The world and his soul are calling for him to see more, taste more, hear more, feel more, express more, discover more. Experience. More.

There are roughly 20 other rich characters in this play that make up his family, friends, the town, the law, and of course, the PLAYERS! In Shake-speare's own life, he was a PLAYER. A member of acting troupes, traveling players, including Leicester's Men and The Lord Chamberlain's Men, out of which he formed a bond with one of the most famous clowns of that original company, William Kempe. Kempe played comic roles, such as Sir John Falstaff, Peter in *Romeo and Juliet*, and Dogberry in *Much Ado About Nothing*.

This story is a celebration of not only plays and players, but of theater and the creative soul. I sought out to honor that sentiment by keeping the life and energy of a traveling troupe of players and having each performance, each audience, receive a special one time only experience. Except for the players portraying WILL and ANNE, each of the other 7 players will perform multiple roles and they will not know what characters they will be reading until they arrive. The theatrical nature of that and embracing the idea of PLAY when performing for you, was one of the most important elements I wanted to share. Highlighting that we love what we do, we couldn't be or do anything else, and that we need you, the audience, there to have this unique experience all together. Any theatrical, live arts event you attend and support, is only done with those people, in that space, at that time, ever. How marvelous!

The word CRY in the title also means more to me now than ever. We are living in a time when theater is not doing well. Now, is the time, when we need to CRY out and celebrate art, and artists. I urge you to support the arts and arts education in any way you can, and I urge you tonight (or today) to let go of the outside world and invest in this special experience we share together. The players and I, and our department are grateful you chose to attend and support us. We invite you to come back throughout the rest of the season, and please enjoy our PLAY!
